Getting sick is something we do not want to have happen to us. Unfortunately it is something that does happen. We usually spend some thought in to leading a life style and taking precautions to try and prevent disease. We also usually make sure we are covered financially in the event of needing medical help.

It is no different for our pets, except that they are dependent on us delivering healthy food, protection from parasites, vaccination and affording health care should the need arise. It is better to prevent illness where possible and your animal's annual check-up should play a vital role in this. Make sure you keep aside enough time to discuss any issues with us at these check-ups. We will also fill in a check list and help guide you should any portion of your preventative care be lacking.

Life has got expensive. When we treat an animal, all of staffing costs, drug and consumable costs, facility costs, cleaning costs, lab costs, insurances and taxes have to be covered, as we are not funded by any charities. We have taken the trouble and effort to supply Hilton with a state of the art facility that has high levels of staff expertise and equipment to make sure your animals are treated at the highest level possible including night care. All this is done at pet medical aid tariff rates. Our facility is referred to by Veterinarians all over KZN and from time to time we even treat other vets animals. We do not lock up and forget about our sick patients when consulting hours end. People are employed and are monitored on CCV camera to continue patient care afterhours. Why do we do this? It is our passion. Our motto is that our patients should be treated for pain, nausea and fed adequately in every case, all the time.

Whilst we can treat animals just as cheaply as anyone else, if animals are receiving higher levels of care, the cost of such treatment increases. You cannot charge for what you do not do and so if you leave too much to chance by not making a proper diagnosis and by not properly monitoring diseases, of course it will be cheaper. I think you will leave too much to chance in such cases and end up with cases doing poorly that could have done better. An example is sick cats on drips not having their potassium levels measured and not being adequately fed. It is well known that such a patient will easily deteriorate and succumb. In the end the disease is blamed and not the treat-

You can help us be the best we can be for your animals by spending time on preventative care, checking potential problems with us early; feeding your animals good quality nutrition, not just well advertised nutrition, bringing any unresolved problems to our attention and placing your animals on medical aid so that they can receive the best treatment possible.

The hospital has also linked with Real Pay to allow payment of unexpected animal medical expenses over a period of time. We can also help in the form of free advice on parasite control and nutrition and in the form of thorough annual check-ups designed to pick up potential problems early. Remember as winter approaches adequate flea control now will pay dividends next summer because you can break the breeding cycle easier in the colder months when they are less prolific.

### Feline Chronic Renal Failure Dr Elge Bester

Chronic kidney failure is a condition wherein the kidneys begin to fail in the removal of the body's waste products from the blood.

The kidneys also regulate the amount of fluid retained by the body and the blood pressure of the cat.

Kidney failure is described by the decrease or total cessation of urination or the increase in urine production by the cat.

The primary cause of chronic kidney failure is due to the progression of age.

Common early clinical signs include the loss of appetite, increase water intake, increased or decreased urine production, increased in the frequency of the urination, poor hair coat, weight loss, vomiting and lethargy.

Diagnosis of Chronic kidney failure in cats is done by a number of tests by the veterinarian. These tests include: urine analysis, blood chemistry testing of which BUN and creatinine is the most important, as well as looking for any electrolyte imbalances present.

Abdominal ultrasound, urine protein measurement and blood pressure

monitoring amongst other things are also required to stage chronic kidney failure.





Management of Chronic kidney disease in cats is of vital importance for the improvement of the clinical signs. The treatment of the disease focuses on proper hydration and water intake, fresh clean water should be available at all times.

Dietary management to prevent weight loss and excessive waste product buildup in the body that needs to then be removed by the kidneys, as well as decreased salt

concentration. Prescription diets have been designed for this exact purpose and will be recommended by the veterinarian.

Dietary optimization is crucial for long term maintenance.

Avoid unnecessary stress and eliminate and treat any concurrent diseases of the cat. Potassium supplementation and phosphate binders may be recommended and other medication e.g Fortekor will be prescribed by the veterinarian if prtein loss in the urine is high.

Early diagnosis and aggressive diagnosis can add up to 3 years to the life of a cat.
